A Happy December

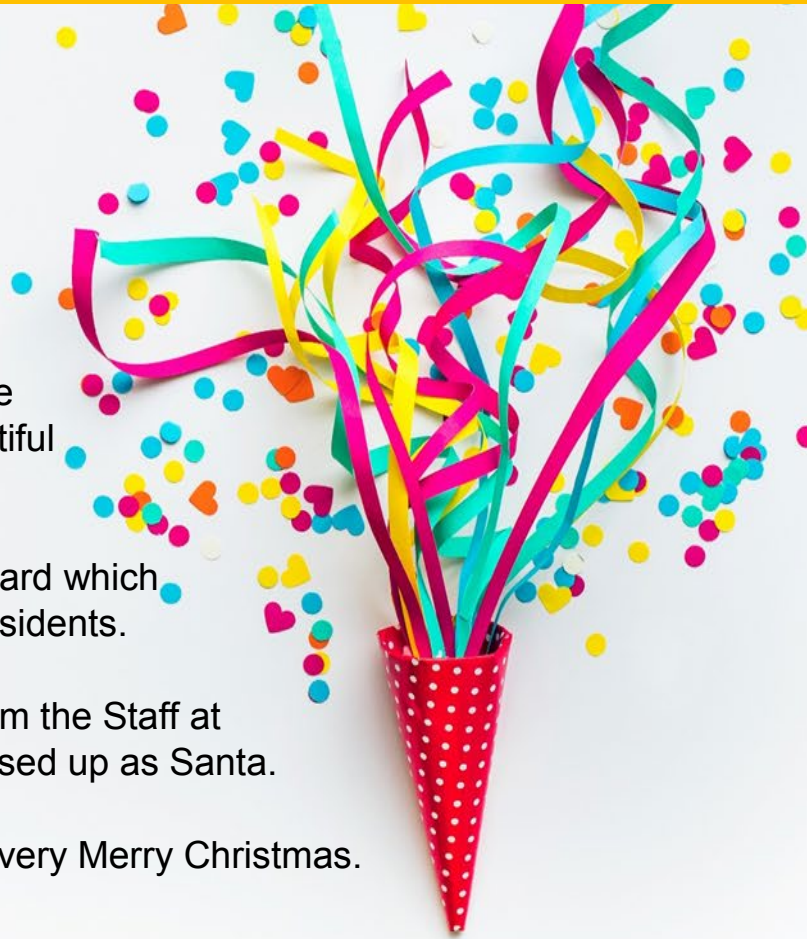
In December residents celebrated Christmas with a special Christmas Afternoon Tea.
